


Changes to newsletter formatting are due to paper supply issues and are hopefully temporary.

ILLEGAL FIREWORKS WARNINGS WILL NOT BE ISSUED. CITATIONS WILL BE.







- It is unlawful to discharge any fireworks or pyrotechnic devices east of red line (see map on the city website).
- In all areas of Farmington, it is unlawful to discharge fireworks or pyrotechnic devices within 20 feet of combustible weeds, grasses, trees, shrubs, fences or structures and city parks, unless specifically designated for use of consumer fireworks.
- Approved fireworks may be discharged from July 2–5th and July 22–25th from 11:00 am–11:00 pm, except on July 4 and 24 when they may be discharged until midnight.


