Consideration of a recommendation to amend Section 3-3-040 of the Farmington City Code

- This is amendment, among other things, the number and term limits of FCHPC members (including the possible addition of alternates).
- Trying to make the FCHPC guidelines to match the Planning Commission
- Try to encourage people from other areas of Farmington to participate
 - Advertise available seats on the historic commission
 - Proposing to decrease size of Commission to 7 instead of 9.
 - Possibly have alternates
 - Darren and Tiffany both expressed that they would be ok allowing their seats to be filled by others if someone else expresses interest.
