1. Clark Lane Historic District Discussion:

Austin Erula (Traffic Eng.) attended the meeting via cell phone and gave this information to the commission he would estimate 10 to 20% reduction in traffic to State Street using the 1525 West option in future. David Peterson was very optimistic about the UDOT letter. He is going to speak with Farmington officials and report back to the commission.

Dorothy read the UDOT letter that David sent to Dorothy to the commission.

David Peterson brought up Farmington State Street Traffic Analysis for review. 400 West option Frontage Road time frame 2-3 years.

Centerville to Farmington: The UDOT Letter left David Peterson and the commission very optimistic that this could possibly be sooner than later.
