



Farmington City Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statement

State law requires all public employees and officials to disclose ownership or participation in any businesses which are either: (1) regulated by Farmington City (the "City"), or (2) does business with or may do business with the City, unless that ownership interest is less than \$2,000. The rule applies to the employee or official's spouse or minor children. Additionally, employees are prohibited from receiving compensation for assisting businesses in transactions with the City unless that employee or official complies with additional, statutory requirements. If you have any doubts about whether a conflict of interest exists, you may request an advisory opinion from the City Attorney's Office.

Outside employment which may create a conflict of interest with your City duties must also be disclosed. This statement must be filed by all employees, elected officials and members of boards or commissions with authority to act on the City's behalf. This document is designated as public.
