this includes keeping frontage free of weeds and debris.

TREES/BRANCHES [11-42-080]

ensuring that trees/branches/shrubs do not overhang into any traffic signs or intersections and do not obstruct sidewalks, etc.

if you are in violation of this, starting July 1st, yellow tags will be placed on your vehicle with a warning and if it is not moved, a citation will be issued. (see page 6)



Over-watering washes fertilizers, pesticides, and herbisides into storm drains. These chemicals kill garden invaders in your yard, but when washed into local waters they poison fish and contaminate water.

The "chemicals only" approach to pest control often causes more problems than it solves. Over 90% of the insects in your lawn and garden are not harmful. Many gardeners use pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers at over 20 times the rate necessary, greatly increasing polluted runoff.



another avenue of having your credit protected further.

2025 FIREWORKS GUIDELINES

The Farmington Fire Department emphasizes caution for fireworks use this summer. No discharge of fireworks is allowed in areas of east Farmington. Refer to the city website for 2025 restrictions and a map, or call the fire department at 801-451-2842.

Fireworks are restricted throughout the city within 20 feet of combustible weeds, grasses, trees, shrubs, fences or structures. All Farmington parks are restricted unless specifically designated for use of consumer fireworks.

Use of illegal fireworks will result in a citation. If you are unsure what types of fireworks are illegal, check the city website. Legal fireworks may be discharged July 2-5 and July 22-25 from 11am – 11pm. On July 4th and 24th, hours are extended to midnight.
