## are you guilty of any of these COMMON CODE VIOLATIONS

As the weather warms, specific code violations are common. You can probably guess what they are.

### WEED CONTROL [7-9-030]

this includes obstructing sidewalks, parking area, gutter, street or any other public way next to such premises – including building materials, dirt, dead trees/stumps, fencing etc., that can obstruct public streets, gutters, parking, sidewalks etc.

### FRONTAGE MAINTENANCE [8-2-080]

this includes keeping frontage free of weeds and debris.

### TREES/BRANCHES [11-42-080]

ensuring that trees/branches/shrubs do not overhang into any traffic signs or intersections and do not obstruct sidewalks, etc.

### TRAILERS/BOATS/ON STREET PARKING [14-5-050]

if you are in violation of this, starting July 1st, yellow tags will be placed on your vehicle with a warning and if it is not moved, a citation will be issued. (see page 6)

### SOLICITORS [6-4-030]

Solicitors must have a Farmington City-issued badge on them at all times while soliciting. If they

ignore your *no soliciting* sign or do not listen to your request to leave the property, call the PD.

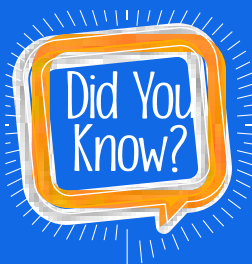
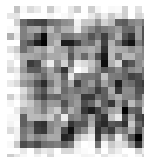
### NOISE CONTROL [[7-10-010]

## STORMWATER POLLUTION

Wastes from yard work are among the many common stormwater pollutants that can degrade water quality. Other

pollutants include paint, oil, automotive fluids, construction debris, pet wastes, litter, pool chemicals, and dirty wash water.

What you do in your yard can directly impact the quality of local water. When soil, organic wastes, and chemicals leave your yard, they flow directly into streams, and ponds, where they can harm human health and the

environment.

Over-watering washes fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides into storm drains. These chemicals kill garden invaders in your yard, but when washed into local waters they poison fish and contaminate water.

The "chemicals only" approach to pest control often causes more problems than it solves. Over 90% of the insects in your lawn and garden are not harmful. Many gardeners use pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers at over 20 times the rate necessary, greatly increasing polluted runoff.

**INTERNET FRAUD / FORGERY**

Fraud and forgery crimes are costly to victims in several different ways. They not only impact you monetarily, they also cost you time and can potentially damage your reputation, affecting your ability to utilize credit when needed. The three main consumer reporting agencies (Equifax, TransUnion, and Experian) are required by federal law to give you one free report each year. The report can be obtained at [www.annualcreditreport.com](http://www.annualcreditreport.com).

If you believe you are a victim of fraud or forgery, there are several steps you must take to start the process:

**R**eport the crime to the appropriate financial institution

**C**omplete an affidavit of forgery

**R**eport crime to the appropriate law enforcement agency

**I**t is highly suggested you place a fraud alert on your credit reporting

**E**quifax: 1-877-579-5734

**E**xperian: 1-888-397-3742

**T**ransUnion: 1-800-680-7289

**NOTE:** You only have to contact one of the above companies; they will alert the other two. After this is done, creditors are required to follow certain procedures if credit is applied for in your name in order to protect you. This may delay your own ability to obtain credit. However, it makes it impossible for the suspect to ruin your credit. Please know this is a free service and it is only good for 90 days. After this time expires, please look into

another avenue of having your credit protected further.

**PREVENTION TIPS**

**K**eep your information private and confidential

**D**o not share account information or PIN numbers over the phone

**D**o not keep PIN numbers in your wallet or purse

**E**nsure your computer is up to date on anti-virus, anti-spyware, and firewall protection

**S**hred documents that contain personal and financial information

**D**o not allow people to remote access on to your computer

**B**anks and credit card companies will not ask for PIN numbers or account information over the phone or through email.

To exclude your name from the nationwide consumer credit reporting company list for unsolicited credit and insurance offers, you can call 1-888-567-8688 or visit [www.optoutprescreen.com](http://www.optoutprescreen.com). This will stop unsolicited mail for several years.

# 2025 FIREWORKS GUIDELINES

The Farmington Fire Department emphasizes caution for fireworks use this summer. No discharge of fireworks is allowed in areas of east Farmington. Refer to the city website for 2025 restrictions and a map, or call the fire department at 801-451-2842.

Fireworks are restricted throughout the city within 20 feet of combustible weeds, grasses, trees, shrubs, fences or structures. All Farmington parks are restricted unless specifically designated for use of consumer fireworks.

Use of illegal fireworks will result in a citation. If you are unsure what types of fireworks are illegal, check the city website. **Legal fireworks may be discharged July 2–5 and July 22–25 from 11am–11pm. On July 4th and 24th, hours are extended to midnight.**

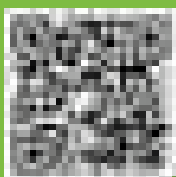

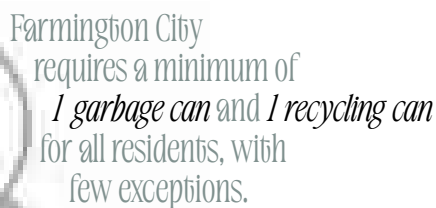

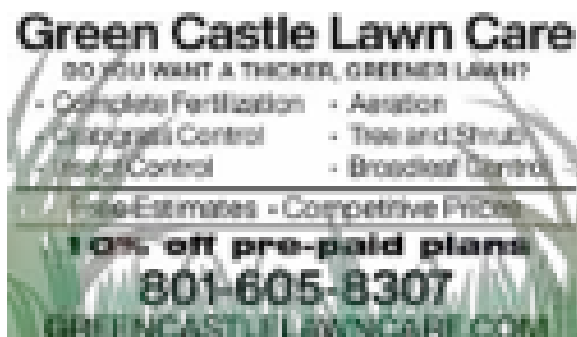
